Speaking of Tubes. . .

Ever see a "QRS Redtop"? It's a fancy tube that was made by the QRS Music Company in Chicago. It was intended for use as a replacement for the UV and UX 200A and 201 A tubes and was advertised as both a detector and an amplifier. Specs on it include a 5 volt, \(\frac{1}{4}\)-amp. filament and plate voltage ranging from 45 to 135.

I have never seen one with an exhaust tip on top, but all of them had a cap of bright red laquer, a nice molded bakelite base, and the letters "QRS" stamped from gold embossed paper stuck to the side of the envelope. Their fancy appearance was somewhat of a sales promotion device, and they also had an unusual internal structure.

A careful look inside the envelope, aided by a lighted filament, reveals two vertically-mounted cylindrical plate elements. Inside each of these is a helical grid and single wire filament. This did not mean the tube was 'twice as good' as any other one because these elements were internally connected in parallel!
