Site in Ardrossan, Scotland on
Aug. 6, 1978.

In 1921 Paul Godley was sent to Scotland by the Radio Club of America to see whether he could receive American Radio Amateur signals on "Short Waves" (i.e., 200 meters), and especially to see whether he could receive a special station set up by the Club, IBCG, at Greenwich, Connecticut.

He set up a beverage antenna and camped out on this wind swept site for about two weeks in a tent in December, 1921. He was very successful in receiving signals from across the Atlantic. He received a much larger proportion of CW signals than spark signals. The results of the test were (1) to encourage further transatlantic work on short waves which ultimately lead to the current development of international communications on high frequencies and (2) to cause the almost immediate abandonment of spark transmitters by amateurs.

This site is about 25 miles southwest of Glasgow and about 15 miles northwest of the Prestwick International Airport. It is located on the coast road on the northwest edge of Ardrossan.

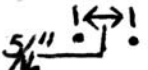

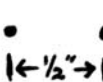
