Current annual dues are \$12. New memberships will be prorated to renewal on the following June, i.e new members joining in May should submit \$12, in December \$5, etc.

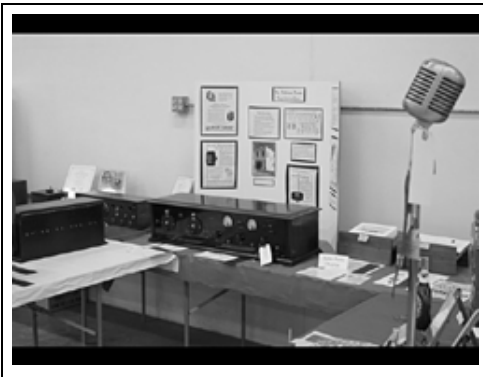

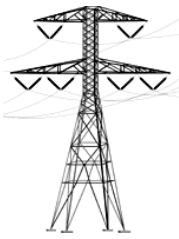

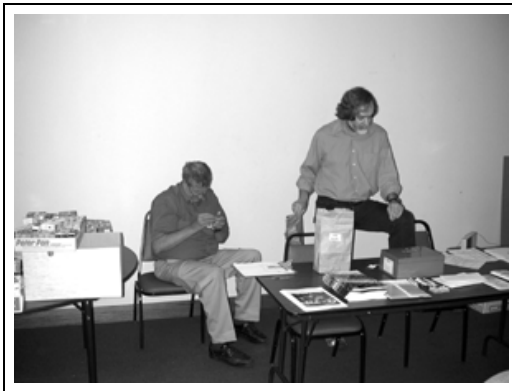
