

I overheard people at the last meeting saying, "I can't write. No one would read anything that I wrote". Well, I can't write either. Larry has assured me that he can "fix" ANYTHING that I send him (he fixed this!). We NEED articles and ideas. You can send me your articles by email, in just plain text format, using Notepad or Wordpad. I also have Microsoft Word and Lotus WordPro if your prefer that format. Just attach the article to your email along with any graphic files (photos) you want included. Any graphic format, .jpg, .gif, .bmp, is OK. If you prefer, you can use the postal service to mail me your articles and photos. Larry and I both have scanners to copy your photos and diagrams.
