

A View from the Tower

he can lick it off! Here I am again reporting from the Breakfast Meet in Colorado Springs. The usual suspects are here, our esteemed president Dennis Laurence has graced us with his presence the last couple of times.

Often, somebody brings an interesting Show and Tell item. It gives us something to paw over and digest. Our pal, Dan Houfek, brought a very interesting radio. As we all know, there are radios in all kinds of forms, including children's consoles, known as "Baby Grands". Well there are also children's toys that are electronic. Dan owns a toy one-tube Radio Phone made by Ideal, a model RT 800. It tunes with the telephone dial.

The same toy Radio Phone was made by other companies as well. Da-Myco Products of NY made



a "Little Orphan Annie Radio-Phone", there was a picture of Annie in the center of the dial. The set operated on components consisting of an on/off switch on the front case, and antenna and ground clips are in the rear. It contained a 3A4 tube, coil, condenser and batteries. "The Moderniare" made by the Vaugh Manufacturing Co. had the same circuit with a 1L4 tube and "book" condensers.

"Annie tuned by rotating the telephone dial. The tuning element is a coil with a moveable core, This permeability tuner is linked to the dial by a dial cord arrangement. The dial is not calibrated, though the numbers from one to zero could be used as a guide. Don's "Ideal" dial reads like a regular radio. These sets were made in 1948 and sold for less than \$5.

Operation of the Ideal consisted of a 5 foot long wire to a supplied antenna board which acts as an aerial. A short wire is attached to ground. The "On" switch and Dial-a-Station are preset. The outside aerial operates on batteries, no special ones are required. Use in any room except the kitchen and bathroom. Don't forget to switch to "OFF".

Er... Say Charlie, can I get a word in?Thanks.... heck. I forgot what I was going to say ... please continue Charlie ... Er, pass the syrup again!

NIKOLA TESLA RITES
TO BE HELD TUESDAY

Yugoslav Government - in - Exile Plans Official State Funeral

Nikola Tesla, father of radio and of the modern electrical transmittion systems, who died Thursday night at the Hotel New Yorker at the age of 86, will receive an official state funeral under the auspices of the Yougoslav Governement-in-Exile, it was announced last night by the Yugoslav Information Center.

The service will be held in the Cathedral of St. John the Divine on Tuesday at 4 P. M. Meanwhile, the body will lie in state at the Campbell Funeral Church, Madison Avenue and Eighty-first Street.

Yugoslavia, where Dr. Tesla was born of Serbian parents, will be officially represented by Ambassador Constantin Fotitch and many present and former high officials of that country. Among them will be Dr. Ivan Shubashich, Governor of Croatia; Dr. bogoljub Jevtich, former Prime Minister of Yugoslavia; Branko Chubrilovich, Yougosalv Minister of Food Supplay and Reconstruction; Franc Snoj, Minister of State representing the Slovenes, and Dr. Tesla's nephew, Sava Kosanovitch, president of the Eastern and Central European Planning Board, representing the Yugoslav, Czechoslovak, Polish and Greek Governments.

Dr. Tesla, who held more than 700 basic patents, is regarded as the man who laid the foundations for modern radio broadcasting and television; for the giant electrical transformers and other transmission apparatus, and for the basic neon lights and fluorescent illu mination.

To the end of his days Dr. Tesla claimed that the Marconi system of wireless telegraphy was an infringement on his method and apparatus for transmitting energy without wires. Dr. Tesla brought suit against Marconi in an effort to gain legal recognition of his claim. He blamed his failure to establish his patent rights to the paucity of technical knowledge at the that time on the difference between wave lengths, particularly between microwaves and short waves. When the distinction finally became clear the original Tesla patents had run out.


