They just get better and better every year.

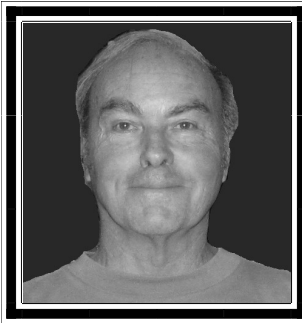
We had a great turnout of plastic and other radios and related items.

Proposed changes to Show Scoring & Categories.

If there is a tie in the scoring, the current method of resolving this is by flipping a coin. I propose to change this to the method used in golf tournaments. First of all, there is no tie for 1st place. If the scoring is a tie for first, then go back and reevaluate the items to make an informed choice for First Place. If there are two or more items with an identical score for Second place, then give two (or more) Second place ribbons and no Third place ribbons. Do the same for a Third Place tie.

I also propose that we create a **MILITARY** category. Right now, most military equipment is shown in the Communications Gear category. This may be appropriate, but the owner could choose to place the item in the Military category instead.

These changes and any others proposed can be discussed at the May meeting.

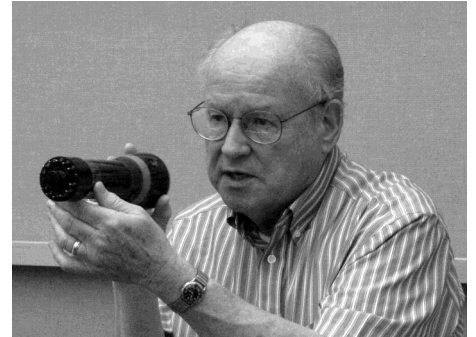

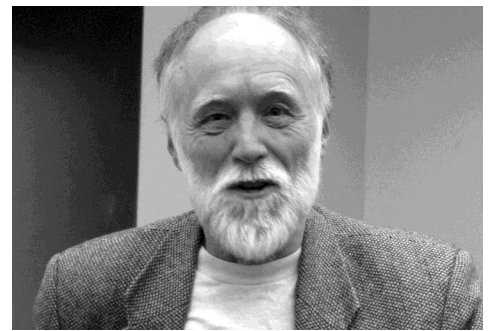
