5. Immediate family is considered to be covered by a single membership.

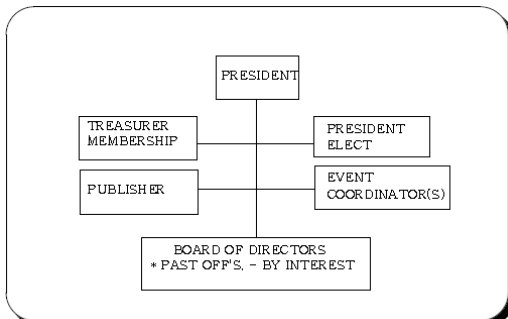
MEETINGS:

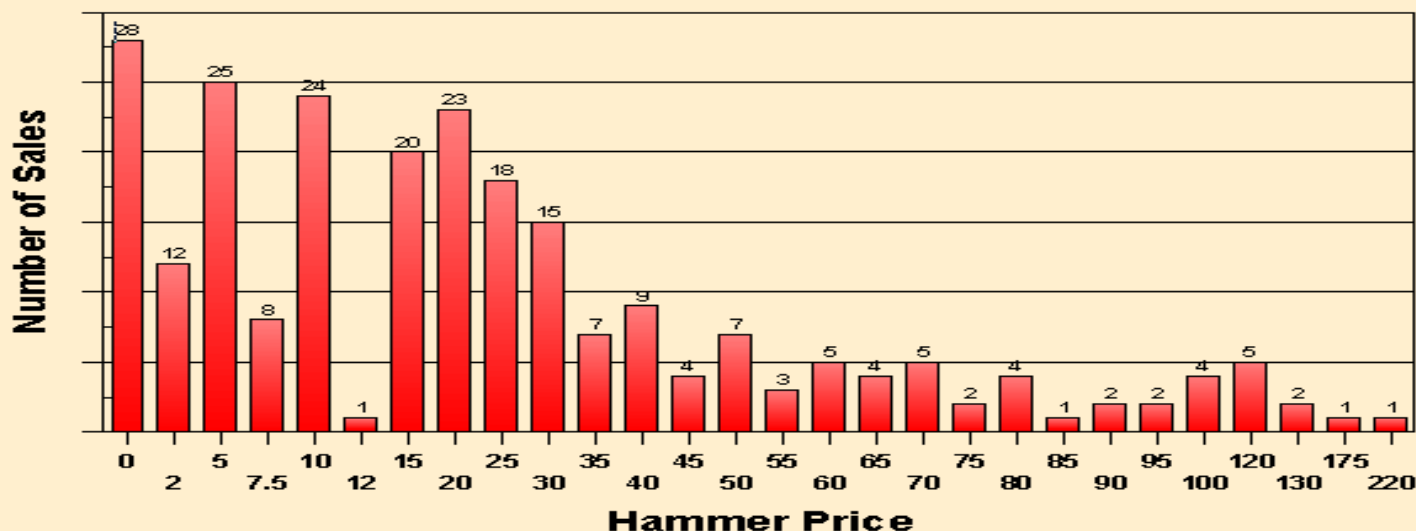

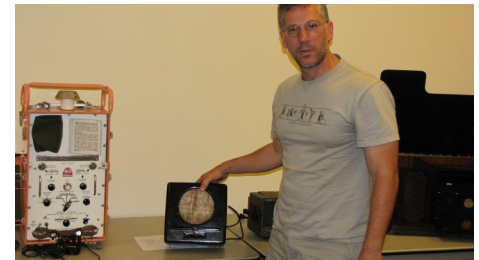
