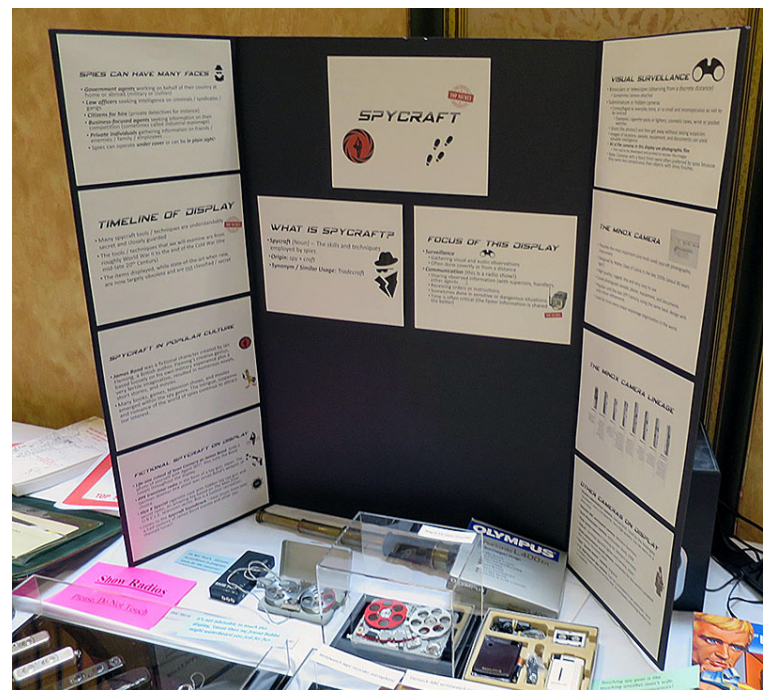

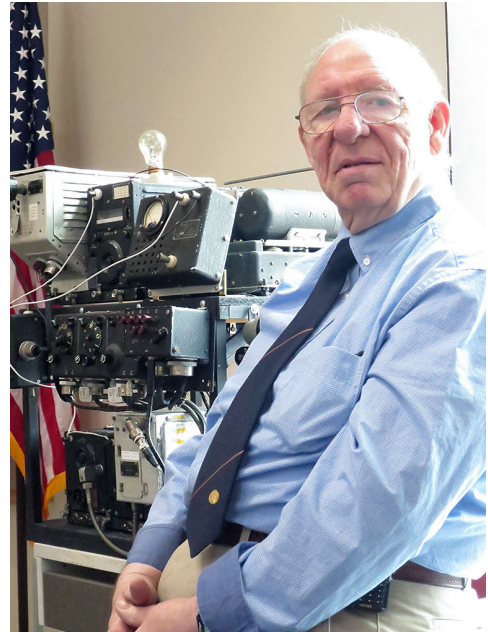

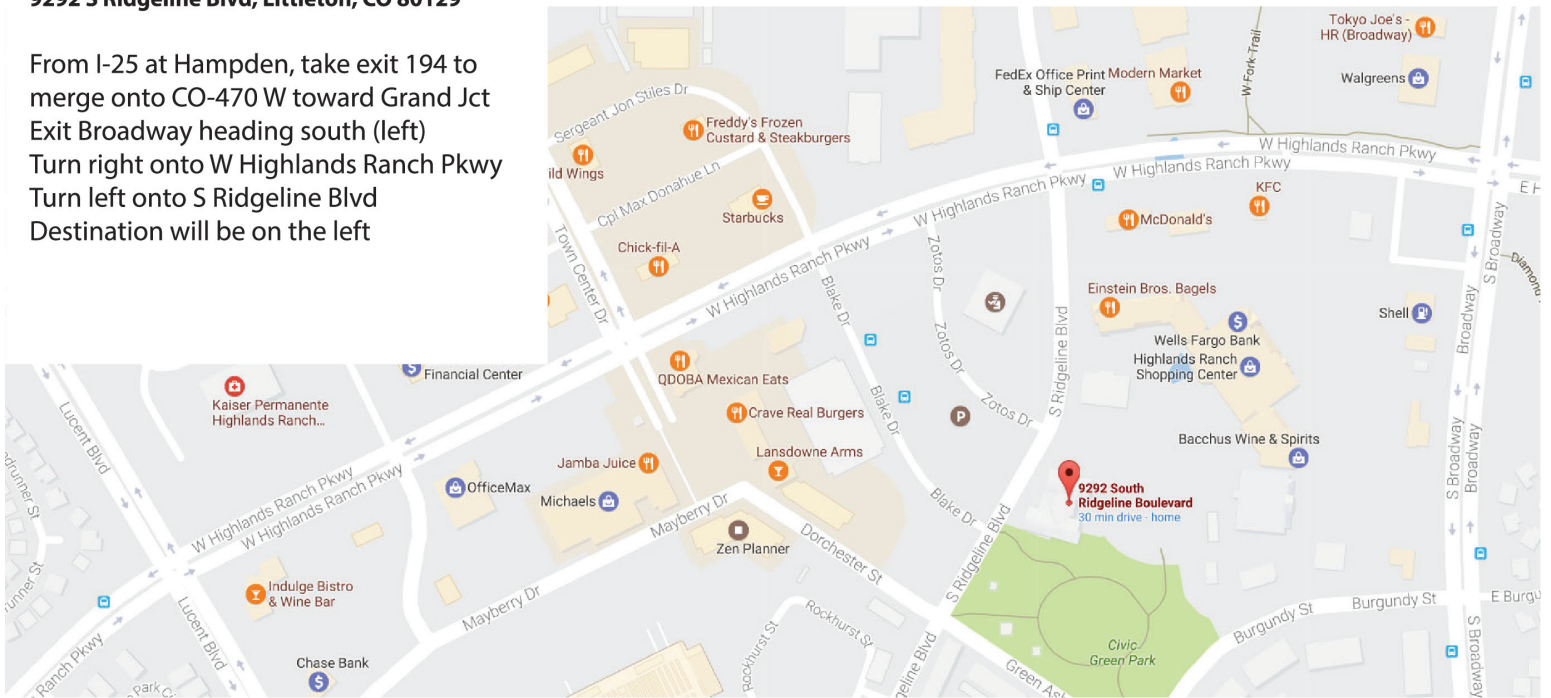
1. Send an email to coloradoradiocollectors@yahoo.com with no subject.
