IT'S TIME FOR THE CRC 2023 ANNUAL AUCTION AND BAR/BQ!

Once again, through the efforts of club member Rich Kuberski, we are privileged to hold our annual auction in a park-like setting. In addition, we will also be continuing our tradition of combining the auction with a pot luck BarBQ.

The club will provide the burgers, hot-dogs, condiments, chips and soft drinks while the members bring side dishes to share with all. **Family members are encouraged to attend!!!** The public is welcome and also encouraged to participate in the festivities and fun.

WHAT: An auction of radios, tv's, documentation, parts, test equipment and associated items.

WHEN: Sunday, September 17th

Seller's Registration: **Seller's must pre-register!** Please see the included registration form on page 6. The registration will be closed once we reach 200 lots, so the earlier you pre-register the better your chances of being included. Buyer's Registration: 10:00am until 11:15. Viewing: As items are delivered.

AUCTION STARTS at12:00 NOON SHARP

BarBQ Lunch Served 10;30am - 11;30 am. Bring a side dish to share with everyone; Slaw, Potato Salad, Fruit Salad, Desserts, Chips, Beans, Your favorite recipe, etc.

WHERE: Tectonic Management Group Inc. Office grounds and picnic facilities (see the

map on the CRC website and also on page 6 in this newsletter).

AUCTION RULES: There is no cost to register as a buyer or seller. **If you are a seller, your seller number is also your buyers number.** There is a sellers commission that will be equal to \$1 or 10% (which ever is greater) of the "hammer" price on each lot sold to any buyer - including the sellers who may elect to "buy back" their lots. There is a Minimum \$5.00 selling bid for all lots. Sellers may optionally, **at pre-registration time only,** set a secret minimum bid (reserve) on any lot. No commission will be incurred on any lot that is not sold. All seller commissions will be deducted from and before the payment to the seller, and these commissions will become the property of the C.R.C. treasury. Buyers can **not** take possession of any lot(s) until the total cost for all purchases are paid. Collection of buyers fees will commence at the conclusion of the sale of the last lot entered into the auction. A buyer's receipt is required for pickup of purchased lots from the lot/item display area.

Payment will be collected from the winning bidders before the sellers are paid. The C.R.C. only accepts CASH or CHECKS, <u>NO</u> Charge/Debit Cards. Identification may be requested from those paying for their purchases by personal check.

- * Sellers will be paid only by C.R.C. check and may for a \$1.00 surcharge, elect to be paid by mail.
- * This auction is limited to radio and electronics related items as described above. The CRC reserves the right to reject items deemed inappropriate.
- * Any item registered for sale by auction may not be sold outside of the auctioneer's control, and can not be removed from the sale once the auction commences.

SELLERS: Must pre-register your items with Steve Touzalin no later than September 10th. A form is included on page 6 of this issue.

Hi fellow radio collectors and enthusiasts.



The Latest CRC Club News



The July 9th 2023, CRC meeting was held at the beautifully restored historical town hall located in the center of Palmer Lake, CO. Getting there was a short easy drive, west from I-25, through very picturesque rural Colorado mountain countryside. In October 2022, the Town of Palmer Lake had been presented with an Award of Excellence for the Civic Restoration of their 1914 era Town Hall by the Historic Preservation Alliance (HPA) of Colorado Springs. Wayne Russert, who is welcoming

members in the photo, arranged the venue and started the meeting off with historical comments about Palmer Lake and the town hall. The hall was built in 1914, the kitchen was added in the 1940's, and the town hosts the oldest Yule Log Celebration in the country. Thank you, Wayne, for arranging this location and the tour of the Palmer Lake Historical Museum after the meeting.



The meeting was held on a clear warm summer day and attended by 24 members, or 50% of the current paid membership. This was an excellent turnout considering that other family activities, on a nice Sunday afternoon, can reduce club attendance during the summer months.

The next item on the agenda was related to the suggestion of eliminating judging & registration at next year's Vintage Voltage Show as presented in the previous Flash. After extensive discussion and commentary by many members of the club, Paul Heller asked for a vote by a show of hands. By an overwhelming majority, it was decided that our participation in the next Vintage Voltage show will be "displays only", i.e., with no registration requirement and no judging during the show.

Next discussed was the topic "Can club members sell items at the Vintage Voltage display tables?". A show of hands indicated that a majority of members would like to do this, on the condition that the sold items stay on display until the end of the show. Paul Heller said this will be discussed with Dana Cain to get her thoughts, since it is her Show.



Rich Kuberski stated the annual BBQ/Auction will be on September 17th at the Tectonic Management Group location. The number of lots will be capped at 200. <u>Pre-registration is required</u>. Further details are included in this issue.


Steve Touzalin discussed his 1933 AC-DC American Bosch Model 355 wooden table radio and displayed a schematic he made and other related information found on the internet.







He also offered 3 booklets, titled "Los Angeles Radio Manufacturing - The First 25 Years", to the club members.






Visiting the Palmer Lake Historical Museum after the meeting




Some Additional Club Announcements:
